What is PPN06/20?

PPN 06/20 launches a new model to deliver social value through government's commercial activities

The model is designed to support:

- Central Government Departments
- Executive Agencies
- Non Departmental Public Bodies

It aims to take account of the additional social benefits that can be achieved through public procurement and create a standardised and complete approach to assessing and incorporating social value in public procurement

Social Value Model

Social Value KPI Reporting

Performance of key social value KPI's are continuously reported as one of the following:

- Good
- Approaching target
- Requires improvements
- Inadequate
- Recorded elsewhere

Typically reported on a 3-monthly basis, however it may suit the social value outcome(s) better reporting every 6-monthly or annual.



CG TOMs Mapping Tool

Proposed Benefits

- Standard list of KPIs that align to the Social Value Model Awarded Criteria and Reporting Metrics
- Promotes standardisation and consistency in public procurement practice - aligns the Social Value Model to the National TOMs Framework
- Supports collaborative commissioning and the use of Framework Agreements
- Opportunity to enable benchmarking of social value benefits delivered from public sector spend
- Access to information that can help develop supplier skills and competencies to improve bid submissions and reporting capabilities
- Opportunity for public, private and third sector organisations to report on their contribution to the SDGs

CG TOMs Mapping Tool Potential Downfalls

- Standardisation can cause issues around bid differentiation
- Facilitates a “DIY” approach
- Lead to a tick-box and output-led exercise
- Built with the purpose of aligning to the TOMs framework - lacks true “golden thread” narrative
